

RETOLD TALES CELEBRATE JEWISH CREATIVITY, CULTURE AND VALUES

Raleigh, NC — Late in the 19th century, an explosion of Jewish creativity produced an outpouring of inspiring short stories to help readers cope with the turbulent effects of modernity on traditional Jewish life in Eastern Europe. In this collection of 12 retold tales, storyteller Scott Hilton Davis offers humorous, poignant, and powerful examples by four of the most beloved Jewish writers of this period: Sholem Aleichem, I. L. Peretz, Sholem Abramovitsh (considered the classic writers of modern Yiddish literature), and their colleague and friend, Jacob Dinezon.

Featured in this revised edition of *Souls Are Flying!* are characters such as the Old Book Peddler who struggles to remain true to his own path; the poor *Melamud* (a Hebrew school teacher of young children) who imagines the world he would create if he were the wealthy banker Rothschild; the orphan boy who learns how to be a *mentsh* (an honorable person); and the *Litvak*, a skeptic from Lithuania, who discovers the heavenly power of a simple good deed.

Although written more than a hundred years ago, these retold tales with their quintessential Jewish values hold important insights for people of all faiths who struggle with today's issues of social injustice, poverty, violence, war, and how to live a life of integrity in a world that seems constantly in turmoil.

Scott Hilton Davis is a life-long storyteller, Emmy Award-winning filmmaker, author, and collector of Jewish short stories from 19th century Eastern Europe. Convinced of the historical, cultural, and ethical significance of stories by Sholem Aleichem, I. L. Peretz, Sholem Abramovitsh, and Jacob Dinezon, Scott began using storytelling to bring these beloved Jewish writers' works to new audiences. He is the author of a collection of eight original short stories called *Chanukah Tales from Oykvetchnik*, and Between Heaven and Earth, four one-act plays based on the stories of I. L. Peretz. He lives in Raleigh, North Carolina.
